European Congress of Immunology

September 6-9 I visited the 4th European Congress of Immunology organized in Vienna by the European Federation of Immunological Sciences. The congress was well organized at a very well suited venue in a pleasant city. Over 3600 participants registered for the conference, resulting in over 400 oral presentations and over 2500 posters that were presented. Despite this overwhelming amount of information available, the very helpful "ECI2015 app" easily guided us to the talks and posters of our interest.
